TERMS & CONDITIONS

Visa Requirements – Attendance and Academic Progress
Students must attend a minimum of 80% of the full-time study requirement (i.e. 20 contact hours per week) and achieve satisfactory academic results. Non-attendance must be supported by documentary evidence (e.g. medical certificate). If a student's attendance falls below 80% or if they do not achieve satisfactory academic results, they have to be reported to the Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC) in accordance with Australian Government regulations. This may lead to the cancellation of the student's visa.

Contact Details
Students must notify the School of any change of contact details (i.e. residential address, telephone number and email address) within 7 days of such change.

Health Cover
It is a requirement of the Australian Government that all international students take out health insurance before being issued with a visa and that the insurance be maintained throughout the student's stay in Australia. The health insurance premium is payable on enrolment. You will be advised of the current cost of health cover with your letter of offer.

Employment and Living Costs
International students are permitted to work up to 20 hours per week during terms and full time during term holidays, provided that work does not interfere with their studies. Students should ensure they are financially independent before coming to Australia. It is recommended that students budget for annual living costs of at least AU\$12,000 above their tuition fees. Students who have school-aged dependents (i.e. unmarried children between 5 and 18 years old) accompanying them to Australia for more than three months are required to ensure that adequate arrangements have been made for their schooling. Their dependents will be charged the full school fee if they are enrolled in either a government or non-government school.

Payment of Fees
All fees are due on enrolment. If fees are not paid on time, the School reserves the right to take action against the student. Such action may include barring access to computers and lessons, and suspension from class. Students may also be charged an administrative and interest fee of \$10 plus 1% a month on the amount out-standing from the day after the due date. If students continue to default on payment of fees, legal action may be taken against them to recover the debt. The School reserves the right to recover from the student the costs of any such action taken. The student's enrolment with the College may also be terminated if they default on payments.

Refund Policy
Requests for a refund must be made in writing and signed by the student applicant. Payment will be made to the applicant only, unless written authorisation is given by the applicant in favour of another party. Refunds will be paid within 4 weeks of receiving the application. The refund policy does not remove the right to take further action under Australia's consumer protection laws or inhibit the student's right to pursue other legal remedies.

Visa Refusal
Where a visa application has been refused, the student must show proof of refusal. Upon receipt of proof of refusal and evidence of payment to the School, fees paid in advance in respect of tuition, Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) and accommodation will be refunded. However, no refund is given if visa refusal is based on breaches of visa conditions.

Other Circumstances
No refund is given if students are dismissed by the School for disciplinary reasons or if a visa is cancelled due to breaches of visa conditions. Applications to defer admission to a later date will only be considered for cogent reasons. The School reserves the right not to offer a course previously made available at its own discretion. If this occurs, and the student is unable (or not willing) to enrol in a similar course at the School and the enrolment is therefore cancelled, all fees paid will be refunded with the exception of the non-refundable fee. This refund will be made within 14 days of the default day.

Use of Personal Information
Personal Information about the student may be shared between the School and the Australian Government and designated authorities and, if relevant, the Tuition Assurance Scheme and the ESOS Assurance Fund Manager. This information includes personal contact details, course enrolment details and changes, and the circumstances of any suspected breach by the student of a student visa condition.

Withdrawal from Course of Study
Notification of withdrawal from a course of study must be made in writing and signed by the student. Fees charged for withdrawal will be calculated based on the date of the receipt of the notice of withdrawal and will be as indicated by the following:
Before commencement of course:
• More than 4 weeks – 30% of course fees paid
• 4 weeks or less – 50% of course fees paid
After commencement of course*:
• No refund
**At least one full term's notice in writing is required of a student's intention to withdraw from a course. If less than one term's notice is given, in addition to the student receiving no refund of the course fees they have already paid, the student has an obligation to pay the following term's fees in lieu of the required notice.*

Non-Refundable Fees
Registration fees, accommodation booking fees and airport pickup fees are due on enrolment and are non-refundable.

Induction/Orientation
At the commencement of the course, students will be required to attend an induction/orientation program. This program usually occurs on the Monday of the first week of the course.

Teaching Methods

Communication is key at university in Australia and at TULC we want to prepare you for effective communication, not only in your studies, but for the hospitality industry and your career.

Using modern text books and industry relevant materials, we present different topics each week as well as valuable hospitality related vocabulary and tasks.

Our students also have the opportunity to spend up to an hour each day developing their skills or working on assessment under the supervision of our academic team.

Class times are Monday to Friday 9am – 3pm with 4 hours of scheduled class plus an additional hour of self-access each day

Assessment Methods

Students on our General English programs are tested weekly in the form of end of unit tests and complete written and spoken work.

In EAP 1 and EAP 2 students will complete weekly tests, as well as formal written and spoken assessment items designed to prepare students for university in Australia.

ESL Entry Criteria

Students should be 17 years of age when starting the English Language Program. Students must be 17 years and 9 months when they enter the Bachelor program. Students will take an English test on arrival to assess which class they should be in.

Location

The campus is located in the village of Leura in the Blue Mountains, just 90km/90min west of Sydney, New South Wales. The Blue Mountains area is a major tourist destination.

Surrounded by natural beauty, the region is famous for its landscape and wildlife but also contemporary restaurants and cafes, luxury hotels and holiday accommodation.

Caring for Students

Counselling services are available to help students with educational issues and adjustment to life in Australia.

Homestay Program

The homestay program gives students a unique opportunity to experience the Australian lifestyle and learn about the culture while improving their English language skills. Students are placed with a homestay family during their time in the program. The families live in the local area and provide the students with a safe, family environment which helps to promote English learning.

Students study on campus allowing them to interact with other international students studying at Blue Mountains. All homestay families are thoroughly screened and regularly checked.

Visa Information

Students must be accepted for full-time study in a registered course or part of a registered course to be eligible for a student visa.

Note: A registered course is an education or training course offered by an Australian education provider registered on the Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS).
